Congratulations to returning and newly elected members.


Emergency Services Levy

I was honoured to be part of the Centenary of the Australian Red Cross in the Hammond Electorate.

Red Cross is one of the world's largest humanitarian movements and Red Cross are always providing an immediate response to natural disasters, continued blood service and their continual work every day to help vulnerable people.

A bit of history about Red Cross – they began the Australian Branch of the British Red Cross Society on 13 August 1914 at Government House in Melbourne which was nine days after the outbreak of World War I.

Hundreds of thousands of volunteers signed up during WWI and by WWII Red Cross became Australia's largest charitable organisation.

Post war Red Cross focussed on social welfare, national emergencies, natural disasters and first aid programs and to this day continue that very important work.
