## No enforcement

RIVER Murray Minister Ian Hunter says he has no desire to make proposed no wash zones enforceable in the future.

In State Parliament earlier this month, he said the government understood that managing boats' wash required consideration of social, operational, safety and environmental factors, including the conflicting views and priorities of diverse groups, and was satisfied that Eco Action was up to the task.

The same day, Member for Hammond Adrian Pederick criticised Eco Action for failing to adequately inform the public about its activities.

"Although a public consultation process has since been mooted following the public backlash, I feel the damage is already done as far as getting the message out to the public," he said.
