The World's Greatest Shave is the Leukaemia Foundation's most important fundraiser, providing vital funds to lessen the impact of blood cancer through research and free support.

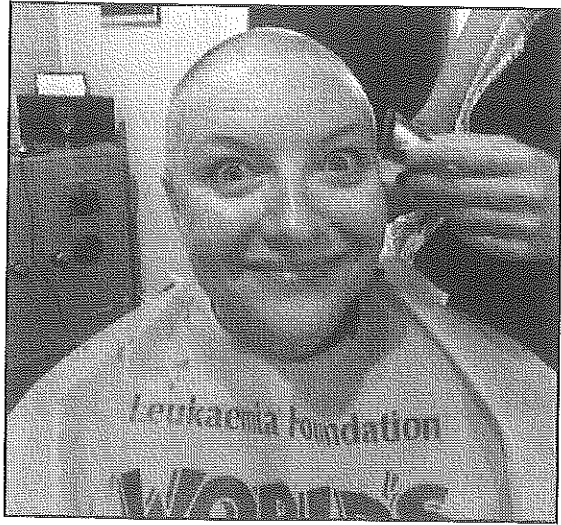
As well as being a fun way to raise funds, the event helps to normalise one of the most visible side effects of treatment.
